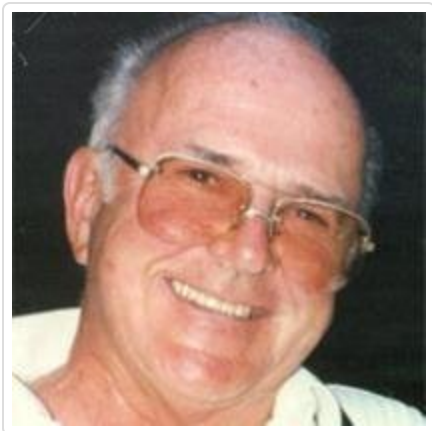




John Schimpf
